	Departmental Project 3 – Sóskút town centre
TASK	The project site for the <b>Departmental Project 3</b> of the spring semester 2015 is the centre of <b>Sóskút</b> . The design project consists of planning different moderately complex public buildings. The sites and the programs are different, rating from the sloping to almost even, from community centre to restorer's workshop. To understand the complex surrounding, to analyse the existing buildings, the relationships are the most important challenges of the semester work. There will be different programs of ca. 6-800m2 depending on the size of the design sites. The studio will first tackle the urban environment in research and design-context and find solutions in larger scale, while during the second part of the semester will design public buildings. The aim is to study both the existing urban context, and the technology that determines the building. Than through understanding and unique design-ideas create new, contemporary architectural solutions.
	The semester starts with the presentation of the programs and the visit of the sites.
	During this course the practise of architecture is seen as a complex flow of ideas based on three parallel motions structuring on one another: 1. SITE - CONTEXT 2. FUNCTION – SPACE 3. TECTONICS - ODNAMENT
	3. TECTONICS – ORNAMENT
PRESENCE	Participation in 70% of the lessons is set as a condition. Only the active practice counts for presence. In case of absence from more than 30% of the total number of lessons the credits of the subject cannot be obtained. Max. 3 lessons absence is allowed.
SCHEDULE OF HANDING IN	During the course three mid-term presentations are to be completed. By the end of the semester all students have to complete and submit her/his project in scale 1:100. The submission of mid-term presentations may be delayed by the maximum of 1 week, but in case of a delayed submission, the value of the project is reduced by 20%!
